He is also helping to lead the NIH-funded Colorado Community Engagement Alliance against COVID-19 Disparities (CO-CEAL), which is designed to bring together our CCTSI Community Engagement and clinical trials infrastructures to reach Colorado's most vulnerable populations with COVID-19 vaccines, testing and therapeutics.

He completed his undergraduate degree and medical school at the University of Kansas, residency at the Medical University of South Carolina in Charleston and a Faculty Development Fellowship at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill.
