## Biography

**Mary Marovich, MD, DTMH, FACP**

**Director of Vaccine Research Program Division of AIDS, NIAID  
National Institutes of Health**

Dr. Mary Anne Marovich joined NIAID's Division of AIDS as the Director of the Vaccine Research Program in 2012 to lead the development, strategic planning and coordination of global clinical testing and preclinical research on HIV vaccines and biologics. The program has built an increasingly complex portfolio of vaccine candidates, monoclonal antibodies and adjuvants for early-stage clinical testing through large-scale international efficacy trials to find effective and acceptable protection from HIV infection.

Marovich comes to NIH from the U.S. Military HIV Research Program, where she served as chief of vaccine research and development since 2005. There, she led, directed and developed a global HIV vaccine research program. Additionally, Marovich worked as the clinic director for MHRP's Rockville Vaccine Assessment Center where she led and directed multiple early-stage HIV and non-HIV vaccine clinical trials. Further, she served as chair of the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research Institutional Review Board.

Marovich earned bachelor's degrees in biochemistry and chemistry at Illinois State University and a medical degree at Loyola University of Chicago-Maywood. In 1993, she completed her internal medicine residency, then became chief medical resident, followed by clinical infectious disease training at the University of Colorado. During residency, Marovich earned a diploma in tropical medicine and hygiene from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons, London School of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene. Marovich worked in NIAID's Laboratory of Parasitic Diseases as a clinical fellow from 1995-1998 and as a clinical associate from 1998-99 while completing her infectious disease fellowship.

A professor of medicine with the Uniformed Services University's Department of Medicine, Marovich has won several honors for academic and teaching excellence. She is a member of the American Medical Association, the American Society of Tropical Medicine and a Fellow of the American College of Physicians.
