What is the Colorado Immersion Training in Community Engagement (CIT)?

The CIT is a six-month experiential learning program designed to expose academic researchers to Community Based Participatory Research (CBPR) principles and practices through a series of directed readings, in-person seminars, structured mentoring and a one-week guided immersion into one of our diverse partner communities.


Who should apply?

CIT is for Colorado-based researchers from all health-related disciplines seeking new skills and knowledge in community engagement and CBPR. Early career researchers, instructors, doctoral students and fellows are encouraged to apply. Applicants must have a faculty appointment at the University of Colorado Anschutz or another CCTSI-affilitated institution. See the application for more detailed information about eligibility.

Do I have to pay to participate in the program?

The CIT program, including travel and lodging expenses for the week-intensive, is subsidized by the CCTSI Community Engagement & Research Core. Participants are expected to cover the cost of their meals, transportation to and from metro-area locations, and other miscellaneous expenses. Participants from outside the Denver-metro area are responsible for any transportation and lodging expenses not related to the week-intensive or otherwise covered by the CCTSI.
