Position Emphasis:

The goal of the Clinical Science Graduate Program is to train nationally competitive clinician/clinical translational scientists by providing a formal and structured educational program in the clinical and translational sciences including formal mentoring with interdisciplinary faculty. Graduates are trained to conduct rigorous, credible and relevant patient-based research within stringent ethical and regulatory guidelines, and translate the evidence for community application.

- *Experience conducting clinical and translational research and science.*
- *Terminal degree at the doctorate level (professional or PhD).* Ideally, a candidate will be a clinician (examples include MD, DPT, PharmD, nurse, dietician, psychologist, speech language pathologist, social worker) with a masters or PhD in clinical science or similar focus.

Preferred Qualifications:

- *Previous experience with graduate education*
- *Previous experience mentoring/advising students/trainees and participation in mentoring training*

Competencies:

- Ability to be an effective educator and leader.
- Ability to advise graduate students.
- Ability to communicate effectively, both in writing and orally.
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with CLSC students, faculty and staff.
- Outstanding customer service skills.
- Demonstrated commitment and leadership ability to advance diversity and inclusion.
- *Include additional competencies relevant to the position*

The position is appropriate for persons wishing to make education and mentoring a substantial part of their academic work.
