He serves as a Faculty Practitioner in Critical Community Engagement for CSU's Access Center, Affiliate Faculty member for CSU's Center for Women's Studies and Gender Research, member of CSU's Undocumented Student Support Committee, board member for the Latino Community Foundation of Colorado and the Interfaith Solidarity and Accompaniment Coalition of Northern Colorado, and member of the New American Subcommittee for the Governor's Office.
